
Creating Closed Captions to the Lectures using Tegrity Editor


We have all the online Lectures in http://tegrity.wku.edu/tegrity/
If you are using Tegrity platform, you'll have the same location but instead of WKU the name of your university.

These Lectures do not have the Closed Captions, for this we wrote a Java program to generate the XML file which sync the audio/video lectures with a transcript.



Creating the ClosedCaptions.xml:

1. Listen to the Lecture and mark it for every 15 seconds with the symbol '^' in a notepad.




2. Open the XML project to create ClosedCaptions.xml file.



3. Enter the transcript, duration of the lecture, and the incremental time, then click on SUBMIT button.




4. ClosedCaptions.xml file is generated.



Manual for creating closed captions

Uploading to Tegrity Server:

- 1. Copy the folder of the specific Lecture on the desktop.
- 2. Open the Class folder and Copy the created ClosedCaptions.xml in the broadcast folder.
- 3. Open the tegrity Editor, in the dialog box select default.htm from the specific lecture folder from the desktop. It opens the Lecture without ClosedCaptions.




4. Select closed captions from Edit menu and the closed captions for the lecture will appear inside the closed caption dialog box, if the XML file is correct.

Note: Any symbols like "%, &, *,..." in the transcript may cause an error to the XML file. It is recommended not to put these symbols or if it's necessary you need to write them directly like, percentage, ampersand...




- 5. Select the show closed captions check box and click OK.
- 6. Select the File menu and click on save.



- 7. Select file menu and click on Upload. It opens a dialog box.
- 8. To Upload the Closed Captions give the webServer as 'tegrity.wku.edu', enter the Username and the password. Copy the path of the file name from tegrity to the destination subfolder.

9. Open the folder from the Tegrity to test if the closed caption is appearing.
